FROM THE VICAR

Today in our "Fruit-Full-ness" series we are looking at Galatians 5:16-26, where the apostle Paul discusses the fruits of the Spirit. This passage highlights the transformative power of spiritual gifts, emphasizing their purpose in cultivating holiness within individuals and communities.

Paul explains a clash between the desires of the flesh and the fruits of the Spirit. He appeals to believers to walk in the Spirit, indicating that when one aligns with these spiritual gifts—love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and selfcontrol—they naturally manifest behaviours that reflect holiness.

This passage invites us to assess whether our actions come from the Spirit or the flesh. It also highlights the communal aspect of spiritual gifts, suggesting that they are not solely for personal edification but also for the collective pursuit of holiness within the body of Christ. Today we are challenged to examine ourselves and see if our life reflects holiness through the cultivation and expression of the fruits of the Spirit—love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. But also, to use them as instruments for transformative change, both within ourselves and in the world around us.

SUNDAY MORNING SERMON NOTES: Fruit-Full-Ness - For Holiness -

READINGS

SENTENCE:

'I am the good shepherd,' says the Lord. 'I know my own and my own know me.' John 10.14

A READING FROM ACTS, CHAPTER 4, VERSES 5-12:

The next day their rulers, elders, and scribes assembled in Jerusalem, with Annas the high priest, Caiaphas, John, and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. When they had made the prisoners stand in their midst, they inquired, 'By what power or by what name did you do this?' Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, 'Rulers of the people and elders, if we are questioned today because of a good deed done to someone who was sick and are asked how this man has been healed, let it be known to all of you, and to all the people of Israel, that this man is standing before you in good health by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead. This Jesus is

"the stone that was rejected by you, the builders;

it has become the cornerstone." There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among mortals by which we must be saved.'

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF PSALMS:

PSALM 23

1 The Lord is my shepherd: therefore can I lack nothing.

2 He will make me lie down in green pastures:

and lead me beside still waters.

3 He will refresh my soul:

and guide me in right pathways for his name's sake.

4 Though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death,

I will fear no evil:

for you are with me, your rod and your staff comfort me.

5 You spread a table before me in the face of those who trouble me: you have anointed my head with oil, and my cup shall be full.

6 Surely your goodness and lovingkindness

will follow me all the days of my life: and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord for ever.

A READING FROM THE LETTER OF PAUL TO THE GALATIANS, CHAPTER 5, VERSE 16-26:

Live by the Spirit, I say, and do not gratify the desires of the flesh. For what the flesh desires is opposed to the Spirit, and what the Spirit desires is opposed to the flesh; for these are opposed to each other, to prevent you from doing what you want. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not subject to the law. Now the works of the flesh are obvious: fornication, impurity, licentiousness, idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, anger, quarrels, dissensions, factions, envy, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these. I am warning you, as I warned you before: those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.

By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit. Let us not become conceited, competing against one another, envying one another.

THE GOSPEL OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST ACCORDING TO JOHN, CHAPTER 10, VERSES 11-18:

'I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ

PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

Lord, have mercy.

For peace among our bishops, clergy and people: Exciting times, Lord as we pray for the Rev'd Canon Sarah Plowman as she prepares to be installed as Assistant Bishop. Quieten the clamour that may surround her, the million questions, her supporters and detractors as she approaches the mission ahead. Peace for Georgia and Hannah also as their Mum moves into this new role.

Let us pray to the Lord, Lord, have mercy.

For peace among the leaders of the nations, and those in authority:

Remove all self-serving from those elected to authority or those that have seized it. Soften their hearts to see people in their distress, to hear

their cries and not harden their hearts to it, but exercise mercy, promote true peace (your peace) and walk in your way. Let us pray to the Lord,

Lord, have mercy.

For the peace of this city of Brisbane and its surrounding neighbours, and for every city and community, and for those who live in them in faith:

Lord help those who need a salve for their troubled hearts and minds find the cooling ointment of your Word, find a relationship with Jesus. Help disenfranchised youth find love and answers in your Chistian communities, be led to Jesus in peace and steered away from false teachings that lead them to violence and false hope.

Let us pray to the Lord,

Lord, have mercy.

For our deliverance from all evil, strife, and need: Although defeated on the Cross, the enemy is still trying to distract as many of the faithful away from you as possible. Give to us all the gift of discernment. Guide us by your Spirit to know what is from you and gives us life and what is from the evil one and brings destruction. Help us not be distracted, but give you our focus as we wait for your coming in glory. Let us pray to the Lord, Lord, have mercy.

Heavenly Father, accept our prayers as we sing

the words Jesus Christ our Saviour taught us:
