### FROM THE VICAR

It is good to be back worshipping with you after my trip to New Zealand for my auntie's funeral. In times of grief, we are reminded again of our deep need for hope that is secure, lasting, and anchored in something far greater than ourselves.

This week in our Hebrew series we turn to Hebrews 9, which invites us to lift our eyes from the earthly to the heavenly. The writer reminds us that while the old covenant tabernacle was beautiful, it was still "made with hands" bound to this creation and therefore temporary. But Christ, our great High Priest, has entered a greater and perfect sanctuary, not of this world, where time and decay hold no power.

The heart of this passage is the incredible effectiveness of Jesus' sacrifice. The blood of animals could only ever provide outward, temporary cleansing. People were declared clean, but their consciences remained burdened. In contrast, Christ offers not the blood of another, but his own life freely, perfectly, once for all. His sacrifice reaches where no ritual ever could: deep into the human heart, cleansing our consciences and restoring us to God.

Because Jesus' redemption is eternal, so is our hope. We do not live from sacrifice to sacrifice, striving to stay clean or earn God's favour. We live from Christ's finished work secure, forgiven, and set free to serve and worship him with joy.

# Week 7 BETTER THAN SACRIFICES

### **SUNDAY MORNING SERMON NOTES:**

### READINGS

#### **SENTENCE:**

May the Lord of peace himself give you peace at all times in all ways. 2 Thessalonians 3.16

### A READING FROM ISAIAH, CHAPTER 65, VERSES 17-25:

For I am about to create new heavens and a new earth;

the former things shall not be remembered or come to mind.

But be glad and rejoice for ever in what I am creating;

for I am about to create Jerusalem as a joy, and its people as a delight.

I will rejoice in Jerusalem, and delight in my people; no more shall the sound of weeping be heard in it,

or the cry of distress.

No more shall there be in it an infant that lives but a few days, or an old person who does not live out a lifetime:

for one who dies at a hundred years will be considered a youth,

and one who falls short of a hundred will be considered accursed.

They shall build houses and inhabit them; they shall plant vineyards and eat their fruit. They shall not build and another inhabit; they shall not plant and another eat;

for like the days of a tree shall the days of my people be,

and my chosen shall long enjoy the work of their hands.

They shall not labour in vain, or bear children for calamity;

for they shall be offspring blessed by the Lord — and their descendants as well.

Before they call I will answer, while they are yet speaking I will hear.

The wolf and the lamb shall feed together, the lion shall eat straw like the ox;

but the serpent—its food shall be dust! They shall not hurt or destroy on all my holy mountain, says the Lord.

#### FOR THE PSALM: SONG OF ISAIAH

'Behold, God is my salvation: I will trust and will not be afraid;

'For the Lord God is my strength and my song: and has become my salvation.'

With joy you will draw water: from the wells of salvation.

### On that day you will say: 'Give thanks to the Lord, call upon his name;

'Make known his deeds among the nations: proclaim that his name is exalted.

### 'Sing God's praises, who has triumphed gloriously:

let this be known in all the world.

'Shout and sing for joy, you that dwell in Zion: for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel.'

### A READING FROM THE LETTER TO THE HEBREWS, CHAPTER 9, VERSES 11-28:

But when Christ came as a high priest of the good things that have come, then through the greater and perfect tent (not made with hands, that is, not of this creation), he entered once for all into the Holy Place, not with the blood of goats and calves, but with his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption. For if the blood of goats and bulls, with the sprinkling of the ashes of a heifer, sanctifies those who have been

defiled so that their flesh is purified, how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without blemish to God, purify our conscience from dead works to worship the living God!

For this reason he is the mediator of a new covenant, so that those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance, because a death has occurred that redeems them from the transgressions under the first covenant. Where a will is involved, the death of the one who made it must be established. For a will takes effect only at death, since it is not in force as long as the one who made it is alive. Hence not even the first covenant was inaugurated without blood. For when every commandment had been told to all the people by Moses in accordance with the law, he took the blood of calves and goats, with water and scarlet wool and hyssop, and sprinkled both the scroll itself and all the people, saying, 'This is the blood of the covenant that God has ordained for you.' And in the same way he sprinkled with the blood both the tent and all the vessels used in worship. Indeed, under the law almost everything is purified with blood, and without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness of sins. Thus it was necessary for the sketches of the heavenly things to be purified with these rites, but the heavenly things themselves need better sacrifices than these. For Christ did not enter a sanctuary made by human hands, a mere copy of the true one, but he entered into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf. Nor was it to offer himself again and again, as the high priest enters the Holy Place year after year with blood that is not his own; for then he would have had to suffer again and again since the foundation of the world. But as it is, he has appeared once for all at the end of the age to remove sin by the sacrifice of himself. And just as it is appointed for mortals to die once, and after that the judgement, so Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin, but to save those who are eagerly waiting for him.

## THE GOSPEL OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST ACCORDING TO LUKE, CHAPTER 21, VERSES 5-19:

When some were speaking about the temple, how it was adorned with beautiful stones and gifts dedicated to God, he said, 'As for these things that you see, the days will come when not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down.'

They asked him, 'Teacher, when will this be, and what will be the sign that this is about to take place?' And he said, 'Beware that you are not led astray; for many will come in my name and say, "I am he!" and, "The time is near!" Do not go after them.

'When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for these things must take place first, but the end will not follow immediately.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be great earthquakes, and in various places famines and plagues; and there will be dreadful portents and great signs from heaven. 'But before all this occurs, they will arrest you and persecute you; they will hand you over to synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors because of my name. This will give you an opportunity to testify. So make up your minds not to prepare your defence in advance; for I will give you words and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to withstand or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, by relatives and friends; and they will put some of you to death. You will be hated by all because of my name. But not a hair of your head will perish. By your endurance you will gain your souls.
