FROM THE VICAR

We have come to the end of our series in Hebrews, and we finish on this Christ the King Sunday as we look at Hebrews 11:1–12, 12:1-2.

Hebrews 11 gives us a sweeping vision of what faith looks like. We hear the stories of men and women who lived trusting in God's promises, promises they could not yet see. Their lives remind us that faith is not wishful thinking, that all the hardship will go away. But confidence in the character of God. They still endured hardship, as they waited for something greater, something eternal.

Then, at the beginning of Hebrews 12, the writer turns our eyes to the one who is the fulfilment of all those hopes: Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of our faith. He is the King who reigns not through power or force, but through self-giving love. He endured the cross for the joy that was set before him, the joy of bringing us home to God. As we fix our eyes on him, we find strength to run with perseverance, just as the saints before us did.

Today, this truth comes alive as we celebrate the baptism of young Harrison. In baptism we declare that Christ the King claims us as his own. Just as the people of faith in Hebrews trusted God's promises, we now entrust Harrison to the powerful, tender care of Jesus. Baptism reminds us that faith is a journey, a race we do not run alone. Christ goes before us, beside us, and within us. As we finish this series, may we continue to fix our eyes on Jesus, our greater King, who has run the race ahead of us and now invites us to follow him into the fullness of life.



SUNDAY MORNING SERMON NOTES:

READINGS

SENTENCE:

Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter of Jerusalem! Lo, your king comes to you; triumphant and victorious is he, humble and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.

Zechariah 9.9

A READING FROM JEREMIAH, CHAPTER 23, VERSES 1-6:

Woe to the shepherds who destroy and scatter the sheep of my pasture! says the Lord. Therefore, thus says the Lord, the God of Israel, concerning the shepherds who shepherd my people: It is you who have scattered my flock, and have driven them away, and you have not attended to them. So I will attend to you for your evil doings, says the Lord. Then I myself will gather the remnant of my flock out of all the lands where I have driven them, and I will bring them back to their fold, and they shall be fruitful and multiply. I will raise up shepherds over them who will shepherd them, and they shall not fear any longer, or be dismayed, nor shall any be missing, says the Lord.

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will raise up for David a righteous Branch, and he shall reign as king and deal wisely, and shall execute justice and righteousness in the land. In his days Judah will be saved and Israel will live in safety. And this is the name by which he will be called: 'The Lord is our righteousness.'

FOR THE PSALM: SONG OF ZECHARIAH

Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel: who has come to his people and set them free.

The Lord has raised up for us a mighty Saviour:

born of the house of his servant David.

Through the holy prophets, God promised of old:

to save us from our enemies, from the hands of all who hate us,

To show mercy to our forebears: and to remember his holy covenant.

This was the oath God swore to our father Abraham:

to set us free from the hands of our enemies,

Free to worship him without fear: holy and righteous before him, all the days of our life.

And you, child, shall be called the prophet of the Most High:

for you will go before the Lord to prepare his way,

To give his people knowledge of salvation: by the forgiveness of their sins.

In the tender compassion of our God: the dawn from on high shall break upon us,

To shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death: and to guide our feet into the way of peace.

A READING FROM THE LETTER TO THE HEBREWS, CHAPTER 11, VERSES 1-12 AND CHAPTER 12, VERSES 1-2:

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. Indeed, by faith our ancestors received approval. By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible. By faith Abel offered to God a more acceptable sacrifice than Cain's. Through this he received approval as righteous, God himself giving approval to his gifts; he died, but through his faith he still speaks. By faith Enoch was taken so that he did not experience death; and 'he was not found, because God had taken him.' For it was attested before he was taken away that 'he had pleased God.' And without faith it is impossible to please God, for whoever would approach him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him. By faith Noah, warned by God about events as yet unseen, respected the warning and built an ark to save his household; by this he condemned the world and became an heir to the righteousness that is in accordance with faith.

By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to set out for a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; and he set out, not knowing where he was going. By faith he stayed for a time in the land he had been promised, as in a foreign land, living in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. For he looked forward to the city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God. By faith he received power of procreation, even though he was too old—and Sarah herself was barren—because he considered him faithful who had promised. Therefore from one person, and this one as good as dead, descendants were born, 'as many as the stars of heaven and as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore.' Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside

every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God.

THE GOSPEL OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST ACCORDING TO LUKE, CHAPTER 23, VERSES 33-43:

When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. Then Jesus said, 'Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing.' And they cast lots to divide his clothing. And the people stood by, watching; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, 'He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!' The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine, and saying, 'If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!' There was also an inscription over him, 'This is the King of the Jews.' One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying, 'Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!' But the other rebuked him, saying, 'Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong.'

Then he said, 'Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.' He replied, 'Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise.'

we pray for this community.

Remember, Jesus, those on the fringes, the forgotten and the unwanted;

- those without work and those whose work is not valued;
- those whom we love, our families, our friends and ourselves.

Jesus, for the reconciliation of your people, rule our hearts and wills;

Jesus, come into your kingdom.

We give you thanks Lord for all the hard work and enthusiasm that has gone into St Mark's Children's Learning Centre in the Episcopal Church in the Philippines.

We pray that the students will be able to benefit from all the elements of their education, as well as being furnished with ways to be emotionally resilient and to live a life marked by spiritual growth.

We give you thanks for the students, the teachers, the community and for all those donors who seek to turn the dream of education for the children of this community into a reality in Christ's name.

Jesus, for the mission of your church, rule our hearts and wills;

Jesus, come into your kingdom.

We give you thanks and praise that in you we see the compassionate heart of God:

we pray for all who are in need.

Remember, Jesus, those in loneliness, grief or despair;

- those in sickness or pain, and all who will die this day;
- those who bring comfort, hope and care to others.

We remember all who have died in your love: those whose lives have been faithful and true; those who have not known or believed in you; those from this parish and all whom we have loved.

Help us to follow in the footsteps of your saints and, when we fail you, forgive us, that, when the deep night of death is past and morning dawns, we shall be with you and all your saints in Paradise. Jesus, first-born from the dead, rule our hearts and wills;

Jesus, come into your kingdom.

Almighty God, you have promised to hear our prayers,

Grant that what we have asked in faith we may by your grace receive, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
